Parent Conferences are around the corner. Start expecting a schedule when to meet with your child's teacher. The schedules will be going home soon. If you have not signed up for a conference or you have not heard from the teacher by November 16, please call the school to schedule one. A parent conference is a time to meet with the teacher one-on-one to see how your child is progressing academically toward meeting the standards in reading, writing, math and science. This is the time to ask questions and learn your child's strengths and academic areas that may need more attention.

**Benchmark Testing** that covers the first trimester common core standards will begin administered the week before break and the week after for students in 2-6<sup>th</sup> grade.

**Preparing for Colder Weather** means it's time to get out the sweaters, jackets, hats, and gloves again. Please put your child's first and last name and teacher name on all outerwear so we can identify who it belongs to.

**Daily Attendance** is crucial to your child's education. Pony Express's attendance rate is 97%. In order to keep our attendance rate up and students on target for learning, we need to make sure students attend school daily. When your child attends schools, they are more likely to succeed academically. It's difficult for the teacher to provide academics when a student is frequently absent. In addition to falling behind in school, students who are not in school on a regular basis are more likely to get into trouble and worse case drop out of school as they get older. Lists of excused absences are listed below. All other absences are considered unexcused and could result in the student being a truant.

#### **Excused Absences**

- 1. Illnesses or injury
- 2. Having medical or dental services rendered.
- 3. Quarantine under the direction of a County or City Health Officer.
- 4. Funeral/memorial service and/or bereavement.
- 5. Court Appearance.
- 6. Religious holidays.

### P.E. NEWS

Just like any other teacher, Physical Education teachers also have standards that must be met. Those Standards can be viewed from the following website: http://www.cde.ca.gov/be/st/ss/documents/pestandards.pdf

Unfortunately for students in grades 1-6, they only receive Physical Education with a credentialed Physical Education teacher twice a week vs. five days a week in middle school. With the limited amount of time that I see the students, my curriculum is driven in three parts.

- 1. Physical fitness testing along with training for fitness testing which is covered at least once a week,
- 2. Skill building making sure to keep with appropriate grade level expectations,
- Positive social interaction which includes peer to peer, small group, and large group activities all of which should be meaningful and should last close to or at least 70% of the time they are in my Physical Education class.

I have a degree in Kinesiology with an emphasis on teaching K-12, a single subject teaching credential, and multiple years of coaching physical education.
